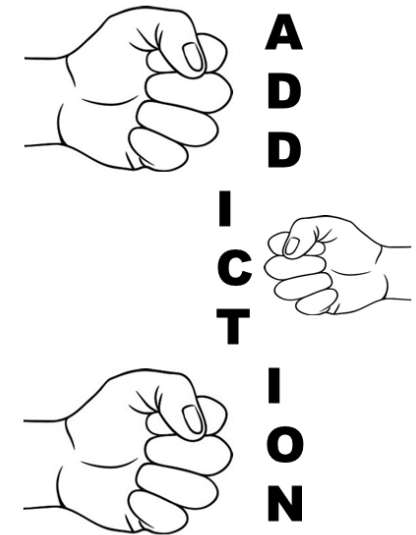

CASS delivers a message of hope to empower residents of Grand Rapids, MI and surrounding areas to win their fight against alcohol and/or drug addiction

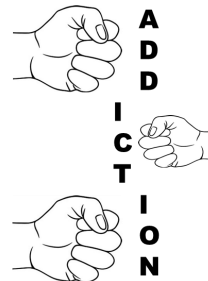
Program Statement:

The founder of Clean and Sober Support, Marvin Ray Hamilton, is a recovering addict of 18 years. Throughout his journey as a recovering alcoholic and drug addict, Marvin has found ways to inspire and encourage others through their journey of recovery. As a part of helping others, Marvin works part-time at New Life Counseling. Marvin completed 40 hours of training in 2014 to become a certified Recovery Coach. During this training, Marvin decided that he wanted to provide a place where “clean and sober people can hang out.” As quoted by Marvin, “I use to do heroin. I was addicted for years until I got to hang around people that wasn’t doing drugs.” In 2014, Marvin organized the first of many clean and sober parties to celebrate sobriety. It is through these parties that people receive a strong message of hope.



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
